

Barry Kienzle was born, raised and educated in northern Kentucky and is in every sense, a Kentucky boy, proud of his heritage and the state he calls home. As such, he is very familiar with its history and culture and feels honored that his first novel, The Crossings, is a story with northern Kentucky origins. Barry studied Accounting at Northern Kentucky University, became a CPA and worked primarily in the accounting and finance areas in construction and real estate development companies, currently as a CFO. As he nears retirement, he is venturing toward a second career in writing and felt compelled to begin it with a novel about an amazing venture of his father's who, in 1932 hopped a freight train and rode it to New Orleans to see the Mardi Gras. Barry's devotion to the community has led him to serve on many boards over time including Habitat for Humanity, senior citizens groups, school and other capital raising campaigns and other not-for-profit organizations. He currently serves on the Boards of Directors of both the Northern Kentucky University Foundation and the Bank of Kentucky.

"The Crossings" is a fast-paced and enjoyable story about a young boy's adventure traveling to New Orleans for Mardi Gras during the depression. It also contains a wonderful message about helping others, or appreciating the help that we receive, as we go through life. George Martin, or Georgie, as his friends call him, is an inquisitive and energetic twelve year old boy growing up in the 1930s. Wherever Georgie is you will likely find his best friend Schmitty, who seems to possess a bit more common sense than his counterpart. Yet more often than not, Georgie seems to wrangle Schmitty into joining him in stirring up trouble of any kind. Barry Kienzle writes a well-researched historical coming-of-age novel set during the Great
Depression in the Greater Cincinnati Area and New Orleans, Louisiana. The protagonist, George
Martin, encounters unexpected growth as a result of challenging familial circumstances and chance
encounters as he embarks on a classical hero's journey. The Crossings or intersections that litter
George's path are life-changing as he struggles to accept the adult responsibility that has
interrupted his carefree childhood. Although George suffers significant loss, he also gains in ways in
which he could not have possibly anticipated. Kienzle's novel reminds us that, amid life's

disappointments, there are many blessings. Young readers as well as mature ones would enjoy the adventure and could benefit from the important thematic lessons presented in The Crossings.

What a fun coming-of-age story that is set in the 1930's, but still applies to its readers today! Georgie, the protagonist, is determined to go against his mother and teachers, and hops a freight train to New Orleans.
