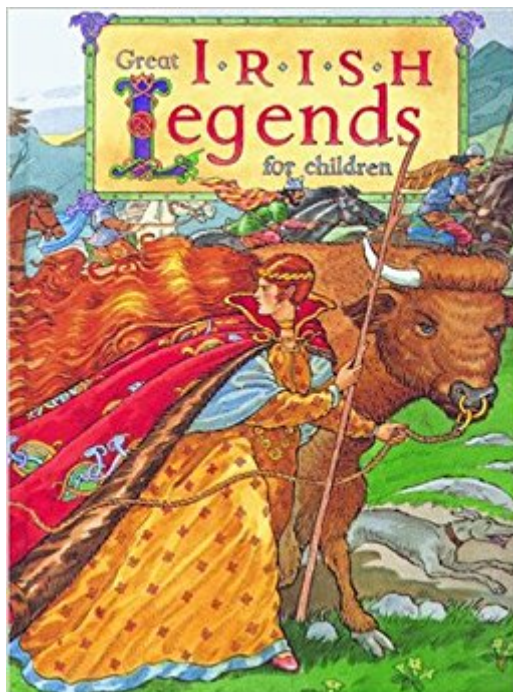

Only 1 really did not seem suitable for a child as it suggests a fake suicide to be able to get what the character wants. The book is sturdy and very colorful. As I am not Irish and did not grow up hearing any Irish tales, I do not know if it is a good representation of Irish lore or not.

I bought this book as a gift for my son, whose father is from Ireland. My husband was pleased with the tales and remembered them as a youth in Ireland. However, the illustrations are what make this book special. You will not be disappointed. It's a great book! Plus, it features a glossary on how to pronounce the Irish words, names.
