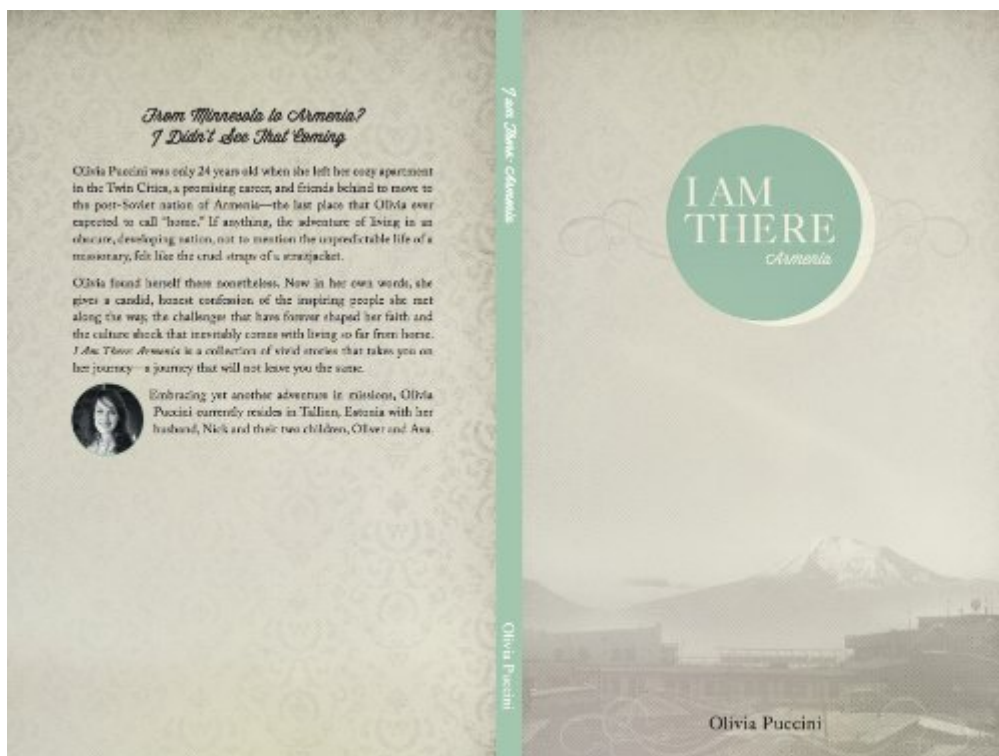

I write with a specific bias, but who doesn't? As someone preparing to take a trip to Armenia, this book provided some great insight into a rich culture, and helps me to better understand a culture and country I've never experienced. Christian or not, this unique perspective seems to undeniably tell the story of faithfulness on the part of both the follower and the leader. Though situations and directions may not always seem clear, faith is sure, and not blind. If you've ever wanted to know what it's like to completely step outside of your comfort zone and plunge head first into a great unknown, this book offers that story and more.

I enjoyed reading this but was disappointed that there were not enough Armenian recollections. Something seemed missing and I continually looked for it but didn't find it.

This is an honest and vulnerable look at the life journey and emotions of a young woman who answers the call of God and travels to Armenia with her husband on their first missionary term. Told with candor, I recommend this to anyone (not just those considering foreign service) who occasionally looks at the call of God on their life with some hesitation.
