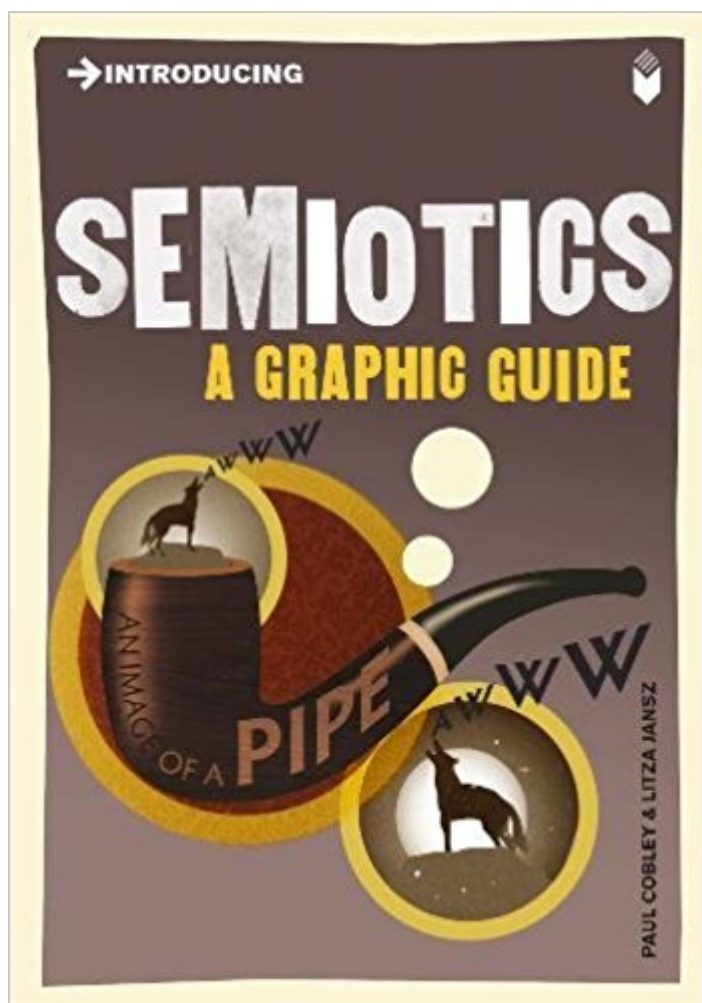

What I like about these series of books is that people who write them cut the "professional" jargon and get straight to the point. Then, one can use the bibliography to delve further into the subject being addressed.

I wish I could give this book a higher rating than 3 because it's a fascinating subject and I learned a lot. But the book needed to use far more examples and analogies to help clarify its heady concepts. In fact, the introduction of each new concept should have been followed by an example. The book did this well in the first half, such as with its explanations of Greek myths, but the second half of the book lacked enough examples. Good book but it should have been better.

Most of the "graphics" in this book are just poorly drawn black & white cartoons meant to be funny rather than examples that help clarify the concepts in semiotics.
