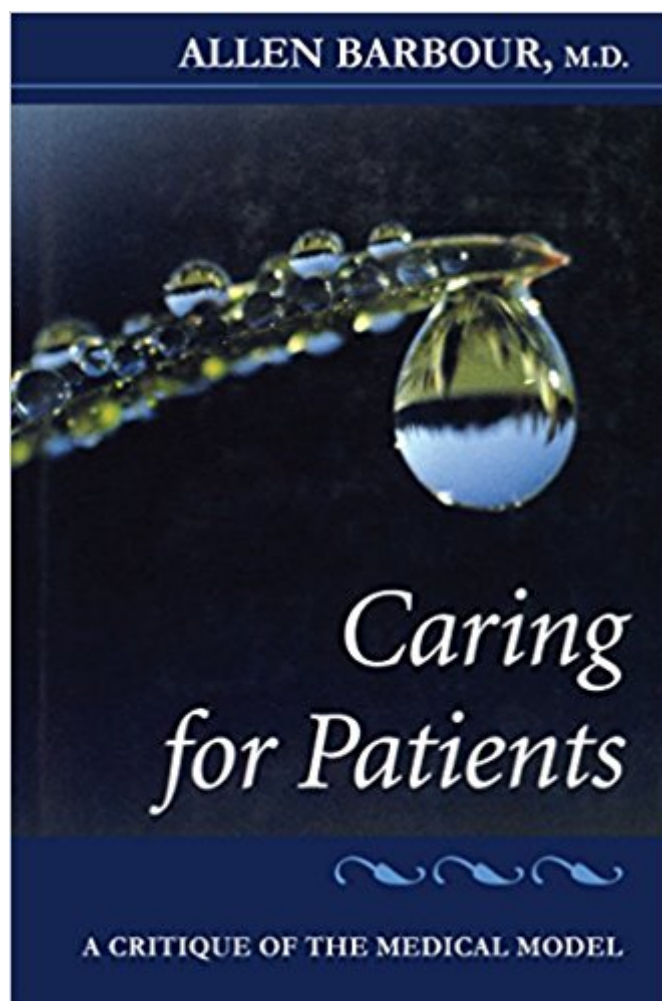

Primary care practitioners who wish to be better at understanding their patients' emotional engines and how these interact with physical complaints will love this book. For this I thank him profusely, because while primary care requires an understanding of physiology, psychiatry, all kinds of theories, etc, our patients benefit only from our actions. This book cries out to have its methods put into practice, and is written to make that possible. If I ever have to cull my medical library, this will be one of the last to go.
