She meets and is instantly attracted to slightly older, dark and mysterious Levi. But of course, she's sworn off 'boys', which is always a red flag that one is waiting right around the corner. At first Levi comes off arrogant and cocky, but her initial attraction to him, and his relentless pursuit of her, wears her down and she begins to see another side of him. The paranormal side. I don't want to give too much more away, because having some mystery while reading a story is nice to have, but I liked that this wasn't your typical vampire/werewolf/fairy story that we've been inundated with as of late. There's enough intrigue to keep you turning the pages of the book (or swiping your screen), and at the ending, there is some resolution, but enough questions that keep you wanting to know what happens next. I purchased book 2 this morning and am looking forward to finding that out just later!

I love reading books with strong female leads, women who fight and stand up for what they believe. Women who despite their limitations, dare to define the status quo. But this is not one of them. The female in this books has to be the world's biggest doormat. She is completely useless!!! She lets herself be used again and again by men. She is plain, boring, and infuriating. I hate this book.

Can she resist his charm and is she strong enough to handle the secret world he is involved in? I honestly struggled with this novel and there were many times I seriously considered giving up. The characters just seemed very two dimensional, and many of the scenes came across as contrived and under-developed. The story was slow to start too. I found it difficult to connect with Allie because she came across as disjointed - strong sometimes and insipidly weak at others. Levi was not a likable character either. He was arrogant and rude at best. Yet the setting of the novel kept me reading. The author's descriptions of New Orleans with its non-stop night-life were intriguing. Near the end of the novel, the plot picked up and there was a little more action, but here again, I felt that the character's actions were just not believable. So, while I was entertained, I sadly will not be continuing with this series.
