

Grenz's text is athorough, middle-of-the-road exposition on theology that covers an incredibly broad range of topics. The author steps back and doesn't get caught up in the arguments between denominations but highlights differences and notes what the prevailing thoughts are. That said, he does write from a Protestant perspective, so if you are more interested in a Roman Catholic,

Eastern Orthodox or Pentecostal view, you probably won't be satisfied with it other than as a good reference.

This book walks through beautifully how the church and God relate to one another and how we understand His showy scriptures. This is a book worth adding to your collection of thoughts of theology.
