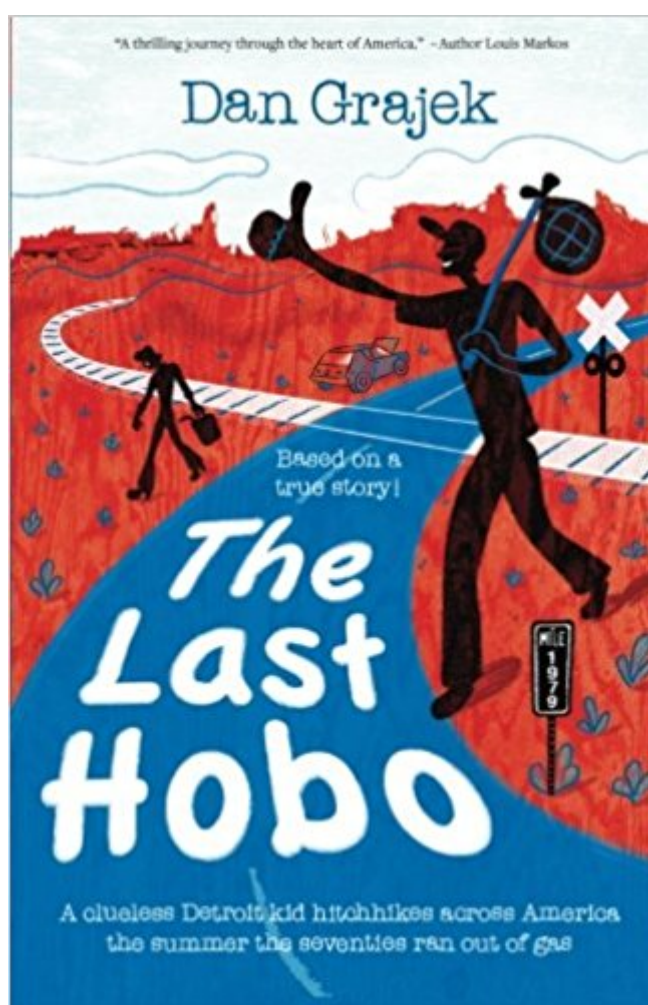

Packed with American pop cultural and historical references, this novel captures the wide-eyed excitement and wonder of a young man's first trip away from home. He meets a spectrum of characters along the way that introduce new ideas to him that we get to see filtered through his rock n roll Americana tinged nerotocism. Even if one hasn't lived through this book's time period, it is likely to inspire a reader to take an adventure of their own.

I'm 25 years old. Though many of the 60s and 70s pop-culture references soared over my head, I thoroughly enjoyed the book. Oddly enough, it reminds me of Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows, my all-time favorite book. Like J.K. Rowling's classic, *The Last Hobo* is a funny, thrilling adventure with detours into heavenly and hellish places. Even the characters "such as Crow and Mrs. O'Neil" remind me of the Harry Potter characters I love. Maybe I'm a little biased (the author is my best friend's dad), but I think the book is truly a masterpiece!

If you can picture a light blue Pinto or a white Gremlin, and you remember what a teach-in is, you'll get a kick out of this book. It tells the tale of the hitchhiking adventure you probably wish you had taken yourself back in the 70s. Or if you are younger, just sit back, take a ride through the old days, and learn something about what makes the baby boomers tick.
