

This well-researched book provides a comprehensive overview of weaving and fiber arts. Each chapter includes historical examples, equipment and techniques, then continues all the way up to 20th century artists making beautiful things. Great for inspiration as well as reference. This isn't necessarily a pattern book. It does contain a few, but it is a reference book on techniques, structures and equipment. My original copy was 'borrowed' by another weaver, so this was a replacement copy for me. It is a must for my weaving library, even after being a weaver for 25 yrs.

Weaving by Shirley Held is the book I used in my college weaving class. It is 388 pages with a thorough content of weaving knowledge. The beginning chapters include a history of weaving with many illustrations of old looms and materials. The following chapters deal with tools and equipment

needed, how to prepare a loom, drafting, loom controlled weaves, weaver controlled weaves, and a section on making simple looms. The following section covers spinning, coloring your own yarn using natural and synthetic dyes, and fabric patterning including Batik, lkat, and screen printing. The final section covers designing projects, and give ample illustrations of pieces made by various artists. I would recommend this book for someone who has basic weaving knowledge and skills.

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
