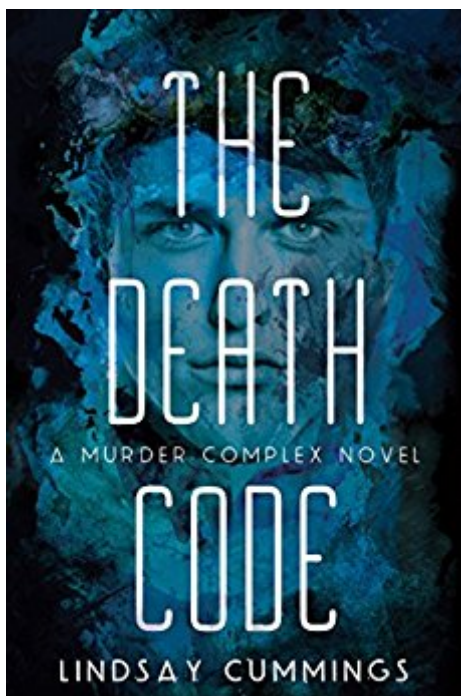

The same here-Meadow continually falls into the same type of abuse by villains-it's no longer interesting- she continues to have the same self talk that no longer matters to readers-in fact, Meadow's character's arc is flat-so yes, it's like Watching cartoon reruns.
