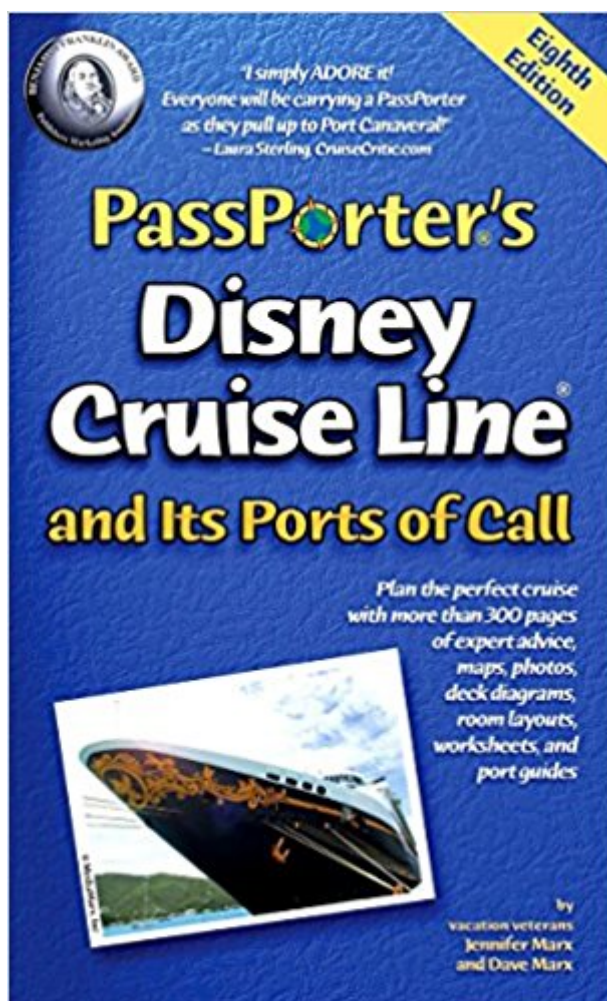

Usually I'm an Unofficial Guide user, but I'd heard such glowing reviews of the Passport books for DCL cruising, I thought I'd give it a try. This guide has been amazingly helpful in planning our first DCL vacation. It explains the ins and out of cruising, both onboard and ashore. It talks about traveling to the port, the terminal, the ports of call, Castaway Cay, dining, onboard entertainment, the children's areas, the adults only areas, pretty much everything you'll need to get started and organized. My only complaint is that it really doesn't have much information on the Dream, however they're already working on the next edition. If you're cruising on the Magic or Wonder in the next 6 months I'd definitely grab this edition. For us, we'll be on the Dream, so I'll be pre-ordering the next edition as soon as it's available. Highly recommended!

Our family of four is taking our first Disney cruise in December and I found this PassPorters guide to be an excellent resource! The book included a brief chapter on every port of call and did not limit itself to activities sponsored by Disney, but also presented some options for exploring the ports yourself (and thus saving some serious bucks!
