

Although most Romans lived outside urban centers, the core of Roman civilization lay in its cities. Daily Life in the Roman City includes a chronology, maps, numerous illustrations, useful appendices (on names, the Roman calendar, clothing and appearance, and construction techniques), a bibliography, and an index. This volume is ideal for high school and college students and for others wishing to examine the realities of life in ancient Rome.

Hard to recommend as a required text for a college course. There's scarcely a single Latin term spelled or translated correctly. For cursus honorum we find cursus honorem; for patria potestas we find pater potestas; for Julia Minor we find Julia Menor; operae is translated "days." More importantly, the book is filled with questionable assertions and outright howlers, such as the statement that Roman women were not citizens (!).
