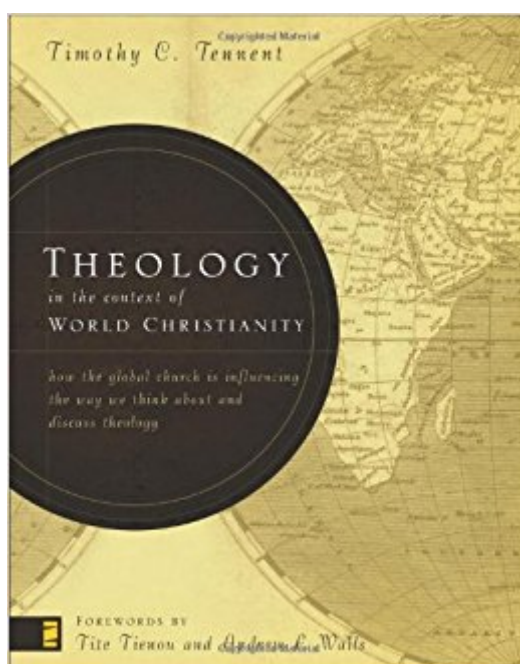

Tennent challenges our western worldview on how we have compartmentalized theology into different spheres. A must-read for any seminary student or laymen and should not be exclusive to those studying intercultural studies or missions work. The words in this book are crucial for anyone intending to work or serve in a post-Christendom and international context.
