McCormick also wrote the novels Cut and Sold, which I am planning on reading in the near future, so I was interested in reading this book as well. One of the things that drew me to this book was the short summary on the back which talks about how the main character's brother was an MVP in baseball but then got mixed up with drugs. I also wanted to read it because my teacher, Ms. Dev, told me that Cut was a good book by Patricia McCormick. So, it made me think that My Brother's Keeper would be a good book too. My Brother's Keeper is about a teenage boy named Toby Malone and his brother Jake, who is usually under the influence of drugs and alcohol. A memorable part of the novel mentions how Toby works for Mr. D's Candy and Collectables shop where he gets free candy every time he walks in. One day Mr. D gave him a mint-condition 1962 Willie Stargell rookie card. He was excited and thought his brother would be excited too. When he got home, his brother Jake was sitting on the couch stoned, watching the Shopping Network Channel. The passage that describes this is on page 15, and it says, "Not only is he not in a yelping-hollering-goofing-around kind of mood, which, to tell you the truth, he's actually never in anymore, he's in one of those moods when he's there, but not really there." This quote got to me because it reminds me of my uncle every time I go over to my grandmother's house. Toby is torn about how to help his brother. He hates the addiction, but at the same time, he doesn't want to get Jake in trouble. On page 125, Toby is talking to his friend, Arthur, about his brother. However, at the same time, he thinks about how he can't really talk about him and his brother, and what the two of them are going through. The quote says "...but which doesn't mean he's the kind of person you can talk about things like your brother turning into someone who comes in at 1:16 all the time." He goes on think about how his "...mom [is] turning into someone who doesn't notice, because she's always on a date with the Food King". My Brother's Keeper is unique to me because I haven't yet read many large novels, but now I will. I like the way Patricia McCormick wrote this novel because her language is clear and understandable, even for struggling readers. In addition to this, the subject matter is relatable and realistic. Hopefully, I will be able to write like her one day. I think that Patricia McCormick's purpose of writing this novel is to keep people like Jake above the influence. For me, My Brother's Keeper was awesome because I know a lot of people that can relate to it. I would recommend this book to all teenagers because a lot of them do drugs or think about doing drugs. I rate this book five stars, because it is interesting and drugs are a real life problem.
