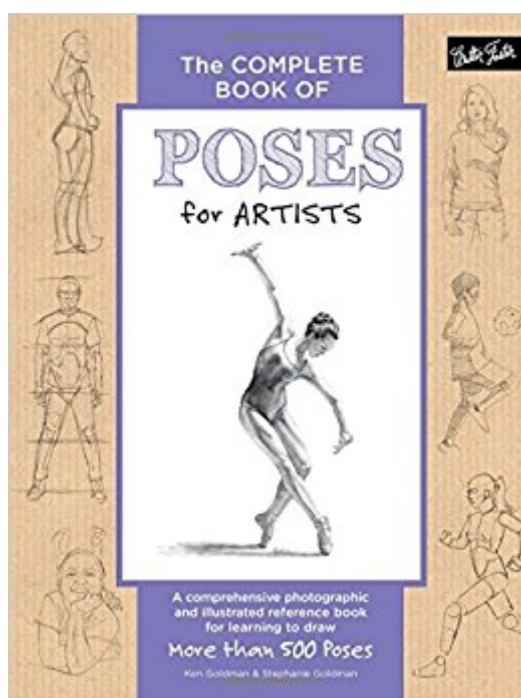

From there, the book reveals how these characteristics come together using light, shape, line, and form to accurately depict the human figure in a variety of everyday poses, including standing, sitting, reclining, and action. Each section features color photographs of people in several "core" poses (e.g., sitting, reclining, and action), as well as multiple variations of those poses. Step-by-step artist illustrations demonstrate how to render the core pose, whereas illustrations and professional tips demonstrate how to turn the core pose into a new variation. In addition, step-by-step drawing instructions and techniques demonstrate how to capture realistic poses as they differ from one person to the next across a range of human characteristics, such as age (child, teen, adult, senior citizen); body type (ectomorph, mesomorph, endomorph); gender; and activity (e.g., athlete, dancer, etc.). As an artist who is passionate about drawing people, I have purchased many books on anatomy and figure drawing and some of them are tough to read. This book however distills, into a very readable format, the most important elements of anatomy, tools, techniques, and practical tips that will be useful to beginners through advanced students/artists. Unlike many books on figure drawing, this one depicts contemporary people in casual, realistic poses. The graphic layout of the book makes it easy to read and visually appealing. Every time I open the book I continue to be amazed at the wealth of practical information it contains. I am not aware of another book that focuses on

movement and balance in poses and how to realistically achieve this in a drawing. This is an essential book for anyone who loves to draw the human figure. Drawing techniques are reviewed, as well. The illustrations are especially strong on pencil drawing solutions for all aspects of rendering people: shading to express form, texture techniques for rendering hair and drapery, plus, simple background treatments. You'll find insights into composition to express emotion, gesture and attitude. This book ought to prompt YOU to draw people!

It is a great resource for anyone who loves to work with a pencil and wants to get better at drawing people. Instructions range from beginning to experienced. The written information is extremely informative but you don't have to read a word to get a ton of information from this beautifully illustrated book. There are many drawn examples. Page through it and look at how backgrounds are handled. Do it again and focus on highlights and shadows, then skin tones, then hair, fabrics, etc. Read the the tutorials later. They are there and excellent. Take in the many useful tips. The book is full of photos of people of all age groups in various poses. Examples are drawn from some of these and exercises are given to practice. I appreciated how to use construction lines to get started. I felt I learned something from every page. This is a quality book. Hardcover, paper, photos, drawings, top notch. It would make a great gift for anyone interested in this subject.
