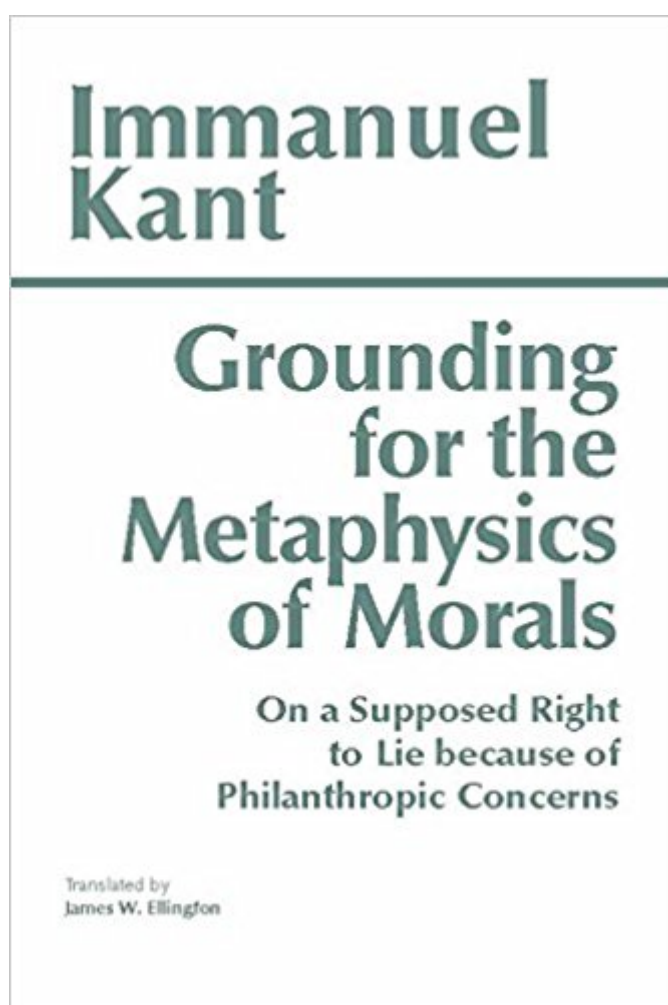

This relatively brief work does not, in my opinion, really add anything significant to Kant's three major critiques: *Pure Reason*, *Practical Reason*, and *Aesthetics*. But it has a very good Introduction by James W. Ellington, the translator. I first read Kant 63 years ago, and have been profoundly influenced by him. In fact, I did an article recently for my Haverford College alumni magazine, which explored my not really understanding the poverty I witnessed in No. Philly on three Quaker weekend work camps in the 1950s (the *ding an sich*, in Kant's terms). But I tried to do whatever I could to make a responsible effort to help in one very modest situation. I think that was a Kantian action.
